



## Revenue Collections Dip Below Official Estimate In August

General Fund revenue collections for the month ended August 2014 totaled \$1.79 billion, which was \$17.9 million, or 1.0%, below estimate. Fiscal year-to-date collections total \$4.04 billion, which is \$10.7 million, or 0.3%, below estimate for the year. Total General Fund revenues collected in August 2014 were \$32.3 million, or 1.8%, above revenue collections in August 2013. For fiscal year 2014-15, General Fund revenue collections are \$355.6 million, or 9.7%, ahead of last year at this time. However, substantial special fund transfers made in July 2014 that did not occur last year account for most of the difference.

Corporation tax collections were below estimate for the month by \$7.6 million, or 14.2%. However, August is not a particularly important or large month for corporation tax revenues.

Sales and use tax collections were \$5.04 million, or 0.6% above estimate for the month. General (i.e. non-motor) SUT was above estimate by \$3.33 million, or 0.5%, and SUT on motor vehicles beat the estimate by \$1.7 million, or 1.5%. August 2014 SUT collections were 3.7% more than last year. For the fiscal year-to-date, SUT collections have grown by 5.1% over FY 2013-14. The FY 2014-15 Official Revenue Estimate calls for overall SUT growth of 3.8% over FY 2013-14.

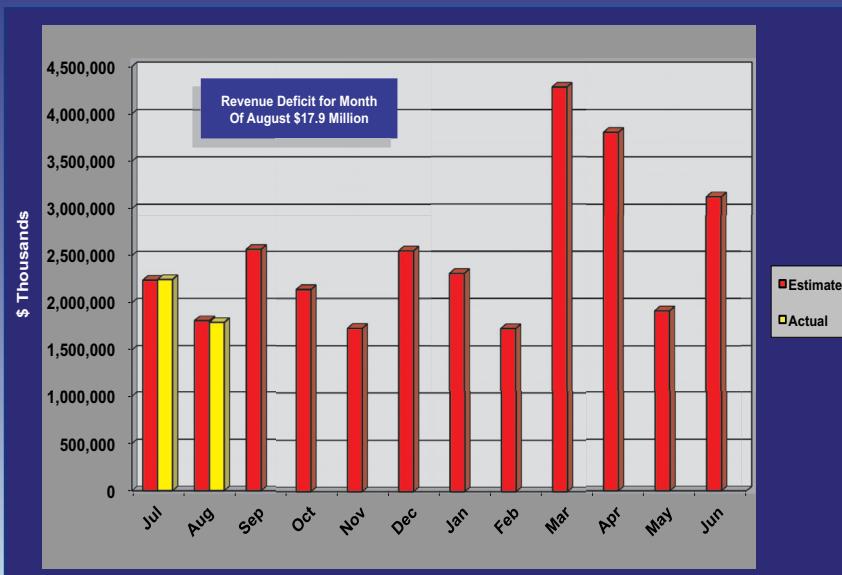
Personal income tax collec-

tions were below estimate by \$2.04 million, or 0.3%, for the month. PIT collections for the current fiscal year are \$22.3 million over FY 2013-14, and each fiscal year has nine large employers' withholding collection days through the end of August. Accordingly, PIT revenue collections are 3.3% ahead of last year. The FY 2014-15 Official Revenue Estimate calls for overall PIT growth of 5.2% over FY 2013-14. However, a significant portion of the growth is expected to occur in April over last year's disappointing collections, which were primarily caused by federal tax changes.

The realty transfer tax was below estimate by \$6.7 million, or 15.6%, and inheritance tax collections were off by \$301,285. Cigarette tax collections were below estimate by \$717,034, liquor tax collections were short of estimate by \$401,529, but table games tax collections exceeded the estimate by \$168,123. Non-tax revenue collections were \$5.4 million, or 25.6%, below estimate for the month of August.

Motor License Fund collections were \$28.1 million above estimate for the month of August, and they are \$28.3 million above estimate for the year-to-date.

## Governor Corbett Signs budget, But Not Before Vetoing Specific Appropriations

The General Assembly passed House Bill 2328, known as the FY 2014-2015 General Appropriations Act, on June 30, 2014. The \$29 billion budget was signed into law on July 10 as Act 1A. However, Governor Corbett chose to line-item veto 38 appropriations, totaling more than \$72 million that would have been directed to various programs and organizations

across the commonwealth. Those programs include the elimination of funding for an historic state park, a study on the effects of natural gas drilling, reimbursement to multiple municipalities for sewage facilities planning efforts and the Civil Air Patrol in the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. In addition, other programs that were not vetoed were placed in budgetary

reserve, such as hospitals, multiple autism programs and the Special Olympics to name a few.

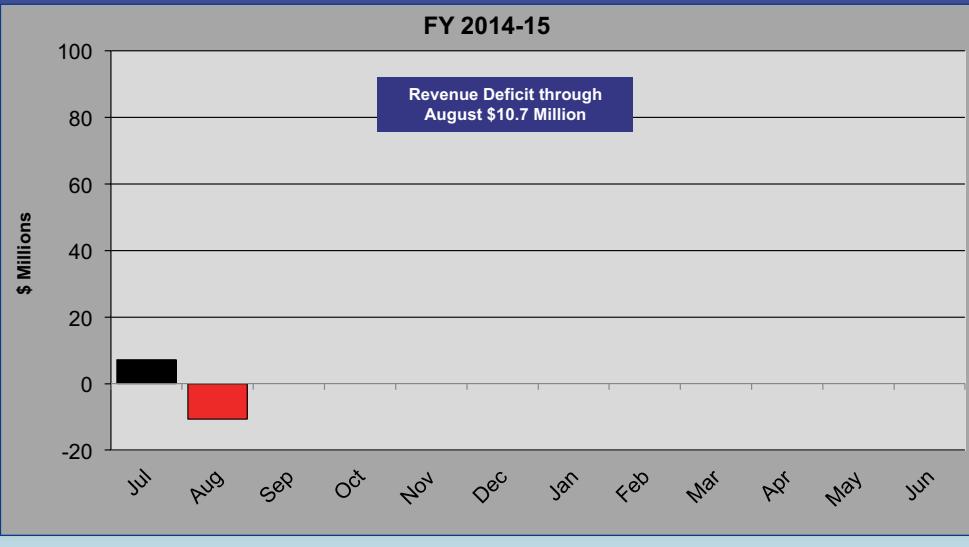

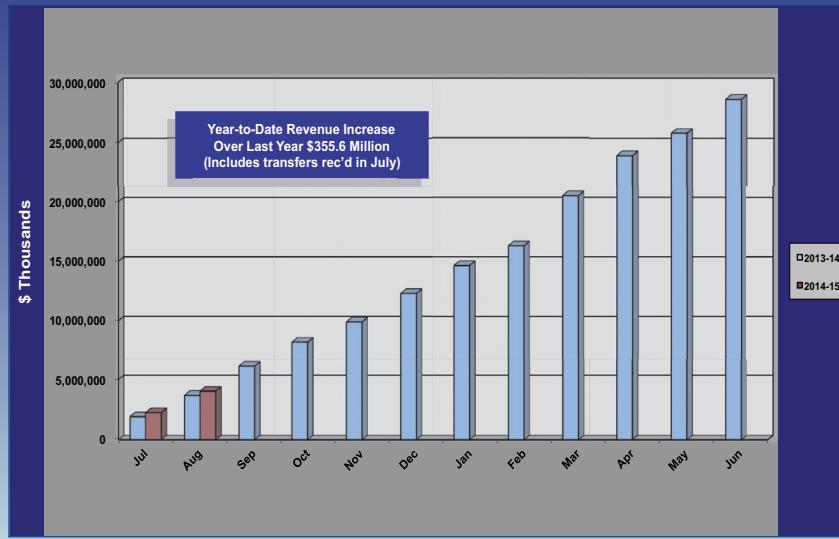

with Official Estimate**

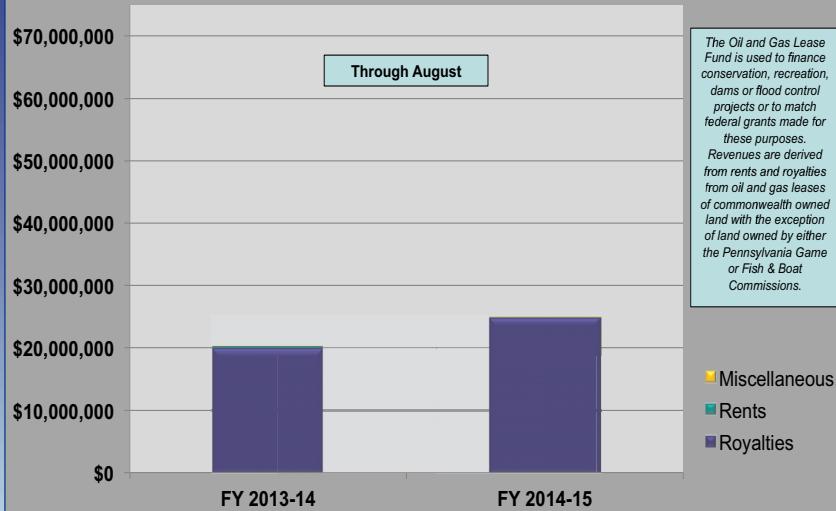


**General Fund Revenue Collections

## **Oil and Gas Lease Fund Year-to-Date Revenue Compared with Prior Year**

Revenues are derived from rents and royalties from oil and gas leases of commonwealth owned land with the exception of land owned by either the Pennsylvania Game or Fish & Boat Commissions.
